VITI/VINI

Clay loam deposits on gentle slopes are the source of the true identity of the domaine. From this unique sedimentation are born sweet and fresh soils for an elegant and mineral wine. The sustainably farmed vineyard is located on a very particular soil, rare and local, called "Sables Fauves", renowned in the Armagnac area for imparting freshness and minerality to the wines. The fruit is destemmed, crushed, and undergoes a short skin maceration. Fermented in stainless steel and aged on the fine lees for three months. Cold stabilized before bottling.

PRODUCER

La Teuf, a French slang term for "party" it was formed by pronouncing "fête" backwards. Once we tasted this delicious Gros Manseng, we were so excited to share it, and the idea of the party was born! Our partner for this wine is Domaine de Laballe, a one of a kind estate nestled in the heart of Southwest France's Armagnac country. The domaine was first bought by Jean Dominique Laudet in 1820. From there it was passed along generation to generation. Nowadays, the 8th generation of the family is running the estate, in the guise of Cyril Laudet and his wife

Julie. Since Laballe is steeped in so much history and pedigree, one might assume they are stuck up and set in their ways. But, this is anything but the case. Cyril and Julie are an absolutely delightful young couple, who have managed to combine know-how and tradition with dynamism and novelty. The couple has a strong commitment to environmentally friendly farming practices and they recently purchased a 5 hectare vineyard, which will be farmed all biodynamically. Using a strong base of centuries full of knowledge, the two are forging ahead into a bright new future... and we're happy to be along for the ride!
